Main proposals

- Adding a safeguarding officer to the committee in line with BP
- Formalising a status of Partners and Affiliates to develop a network of approved gyms.

- It was agreed that no member with a vested interest to be elected into the executive committee EG any gym owners
- Team selections are to be carried out objectively based on points.
